The Orthodox Church is the direct continuation of the Church of the Apostolic Age.

Our church was built on these grounds in 1964, eight years after the first Greek Orthodox Divine Liturgy was conducted in San Mateo County. Once the land was obtained, parishioners came together to build a temporary altar so that services could be enjoyed outdoors on Sunday mornings followed by joyous picnics on the serene grounds. Construction of the church took approximately 14 months, and the first Divine Liturgy held in the church was in observance of the Feast Day of the Holy Cross, September 14, one of the holiest days on the Orthodox calendar.

We welcome you to our beautiful, award-winning Byzantinestyle church. The building itself follows a very specific lay-out characteristic of classic Byzantine architecture. Holy Cross is a traditional cruciform structure forming an equal-sided cross with a dome in the center.

Tours of the church will be conducted daily during the Festival weekend (please consult the Festival Schedule on page 4). We hope to tell you something about Orthodox faith and tradition, and the symbolism of our church as reflected in the architecture and iconography, including the recent addition of magnificent

Throughout the year, the Holy Cross community comes together to celebrate many feast days and cultural events.

These include:

January: the New Year is celebrated by the cutting of the Vasilopita — the traditional sweetbread with its buried "lucky" coin commemorates a miracle performed by St. Basil. [first Sunday following January 5]

January/February: Annual Crab Feed.

February: just before the start of Lent, there is a Greek version of Mardi Gras which is the Apokreatiko Glendi — a wonderful dinner event featuring Greek dancing performances. The following day begins six weeks of Lenten fast and no more dancing until the joyous Pascha (Easter) celebration.

March 25th celebrates both the Annunciation of the Mother of God and Greek Independence Day (birth of the modern Greek state in 1821).

Palm Sunday is traditionally a beautiful day with Palm Crosses distributed to everyone present and a delicious traditional fish luncheon before the start of Holy Week and its daily services in commemoration of the Passion and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Pascha: after the celebration of the Resurrection Liturgy and breaking the fast with a traditional meal of Avgolemono soup, cheese, olives and red eggs, the community gathers again a few hours later for the Agape Vespers and Picnic on the church grounds, to feast on lamb and rejoice in the fellowship of friends and family.

May: the Philoptochos hosts its annual Fashion Show fundraiser with mouth-watering food served by fabulous waiters (drafted from the ranks of husbands and sons!) and tempting fashions modeled by our own women and provided by generous local boutiques.

June and July are full of opportunities to learn to cook the Greek way! Barely a day in the calendar is empty of cooks and bakers as we prepare for the wonderful Belmont Greek Festival over Labor Day weekend.

August 15th celebrates the Dormition (or falling asleep) of the Panagia, the Mother of God. The two weeks of fasting and services culminate in church services followed by a celebration on the grounds of the church.

Labor Day weekend is the annual Belmont Greek Festival! Come join us for the best festival in Northern California.

September 14th we gather to celebrate our church's name day, the Exaltation of the Precious and Life-Giving Cross. A true and authentic Holy Relic of the Cross of our Lord is brought out for veneration by the people.

November: two weeks before Thanksgiving the youth and families gather for a potluck Piece Meal. Traditional American dishes are offered as everyone gives thanks for the fellowship and community around us.

After Thanksgiving, visit us and select a beautiful fresh Christmas tree from our lot.

The second Sunday of December is both the Philoptochos Christmas tea in the afternoon and the Christmas pageant in the evening. The women prepare delicacies as they raise funds to support the annual Christmas Family Sharing program where the entire church community donates gifts and money for families in need in San Mateo County, as well as collect items to be donated to homeless shelters.

December 25, Christmas: we celebrate the nativity of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, with joyful divine services on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

CHURCH HISTORY

CHURCH HISTORY EVENTS AND TIMELINE

In the beginning was the Word. And the Word was God. The first Church, the Orthodox Church, began with Christ and His apostles. The Greek Orthodox Church of the Holy Cross is the same "ecclesia" or "congregation" which was born at the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in Jerusalem on Pentecost.

Throughout the centuries, the same teachings, the same principles and the same head have remained: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

The Orthodox Church is the direct continuation of the Church of the Apostolic Age. For the first thousand years of her history, the Church of the New Testament was composed of five patriarchal centers - Jerusalem, Antioch, Rome, Alexandria, and Constantinople — and remained "One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church."

With the events culminating in AD 1054, a Great Schism occurred between the Bishop of Rome and the other four Christian centers or Patriarchates.

Nearly a thousand years later, the four historical patriarchates of Pentecost (The Coming of the Holy Spirit) remain intact, maintaining the Orthodox Apostolic Faith of the inspired New Testament record.


The Orthodox Church is the second largest Christian tradition in the world. It is comprised of over 300 million Christians worldwide. Even with such a membership, it remains foreign to most people, being considered by many to be "the best kept secret."

Mr. Sirio Tonelli, internationally renowned artist, master Byzantine Iconographer and President of Tonelli Fine Art Studios, passed away on June 3, 2019. He was born in Sarzana, Italy in 1922 and arrived in the US in 1948 on a scholarship to the Art Institute of Chicago following WWII. He soon moved to Omaha, NE and began producing original artwork for Catholic Churches. His oil painting of Christ, featured on the front page of the Omaha World Herald on Christmas Day in 1953, helped launch his career. In 1954 he founded Tonelli Studios and established a studio in Pietrasanta, Italy, where his work continues under the direction of his son, John Tonelli. His mosaics, frescos, stained glass windows, and designs in marble bronze and wood grace the interiors of over 100 churches around the United States. In the 1990s he was commissioned to design the Congressional Medal of Honor and was awarded an honorary doctorate degree by Georgia State University.

Mr. Tonelli began designing and installing the beautiful mosaic iconography at Holy Cross in 1993 with his first icon in the Oaks depicting the encounter of Three Angels with the Prophet Abraham and his wife Sarah at the Oaks in Mamre. In 2002 the first of many mosaic icons would be written and installed on the walls of our sanctuary.

We are deeply saddened by his death yet comforted through our Lord's glorious Resurrection, that through his God given talent, Sirio brought Glory to God and His Holy Name through his inspirational mosaic iconography that adorns many churches throughout America. May his memory be eternal!




Holy Cross began our iconography project in 2000, with the first mosaics being installed in 2002.

This is the icon of Creation and the 4 panels below depict Noah loading the Ark, Abraham sacrificing Isaac, Moses and the Burning Bush, and the Holy Three Youths in the Furnace.

An icon is an image (usually twodimensional) of Christ, the saints, angels, important biblical events, parables, or events in the history of the Church. Byzantine icons are sacred—visual and spiritual treasures of the Orthodox Church. They are an integral part of our Orthodox faith. Orthodox Christians pray in the presence of icons, but we do not pray to the image. Icons lift up our minds from earthly things to the heavenly. Saint John of Damascus wrote, "We are led by perceptible icons to the contemplation of the divine and spiritual."



The Aurora Mandolin Orchestra, under the direction of Josephine Pellegrini, will present music from many countries of the Mediterranean and beyond. The uniqueness of this group is its varied repertoire and the fact that it is one of the few remaining mandolin orchestras in California, and its longevity. Organized in the early '20s by Italian immigrants, the group reached its zenith in the mid to late '30s. They performed at the SF World's Fair in 1939, and later played at the San Francisco Symphony's festive opening night at Davies Symphony Hall.

Gino Pellegrini, was a member of the original "Aurora" in the late 1930s and represents the thread of continuity to the present organization which he reorganized in 1970 until his passing in 2006. His wife, Josephine, assumed the role of Director/Conductor and continues presenting diverse programs at various venues, to audiences throughout the Bay Area. There are over 30 musicians playing mandolin, mandola, mandocellos, guitar, string bass, accordion and flute.

The next few pages will tell you everything you need to know about this 51st Belmont Greek Festival. Dance, music, cooking demonstrations and stage performances take place throughout the 2 days of the festival; please consult the Schedule on page 4 for locations and times.

THE CHURCH

Two tours will be conducted daily throughout the weekend with a brief explanation on the Orthodox Church, along with a presentation on the symbolism of the beautiful award-winning Byzantine-style church. In addition, you will see the latest phases of our mosaic iconography, evoking a solemn reverence from those who prayerfully enter. Sunday's earlier tour will feature music from the Holy Cross Choir.

THE AMPHITHEATER

LOUKOUMADES – Light, crisp balls of dough deep-fried to a golden brown and drenched in a honey syrup. The wafting aroma of cinnamon, walnuts and honey will tempt you as you approach the booth! This tasty delight originated in ancient Greece, where they were given as tokens to winners of games at their festivals.

PASTRY SELECTIONS

Enjoy our exquisite Greek pastries, found in both the indoor Kafenion and the outdoor Pastry Booth next to the bandstand.

BAKLAVA – Thirty or more nut-filled, paper-thin layers of filo glazed in a honey-based syrup make this the king of desserts. Every country in the Near East claims baklava as its own.

GALAKTOBOURIKO - A traditional Greek dessert made with layers of golden-brown crispy filo, sprinkled with melted butter, filled with the creamiest custard and bathed in simple syrup.

KATAIFI - A Greek pastry made from shredded filo dough and filled with walnuts soaked in a cinnamon-flavored sugar syrup.

KARIDOPITA – Delicious shredded nut pastries- a variation of Baklava.

KOULOURAKIA – Small twists of butter cookies. Traditional (and perfect) with coffee.

KOURAMBIEDES – Powdered sugar-coated butter cookies that melt in your mouth. They are served at weddings, at Christmas, on special occasions such as namedays, holidays ... and Festivals!

MELOMAKARONA – Cookies drenched in honey and sprinkled with a spiced nut mixture.

PAXIMADIA- Delicious Greek Biscotti

PORTOKALOPITA – A fluffy and colorful orange cake soaked in a delicious orange and cinnamon syrup!



FESTIVAL ORIGINS CELEBRATING OUR HERITAGE

IN MEMORIAM

The Origins of the Belmont Greek Festival

By George Liviakis

In 1970, the Church of the Holy Cross in Belmont presented its first Greek festival, possibly the first of its kind on the West Coast. The concept for this Greek festival came from village celebrations or "panigiria" held throughout Greece. Traditionally, each Greek village or town celebrates a panigiri on or near the local church's "nameday," the special day set aside to remember the saint or sacred event after which the church is named.

When I visited Greece in 1963, my relatives took me to my first panigiri in the Cretan village of Kefala. The event took place on the local church's nameday, August 15, a major Church holiday commemorating the Dormition of the Virgin Mary. The setting was a large park in the center of the town. At the forefront was the church, where visitors would light a candle before proceeding to the festivities. The park setting included food booths and other concessions, a central stage for entertainment by musicians, choral groups, and costumed villagers presenting their native dances. All who attended enjoyed the lively music, dancing, singing, and delicious food.

In 1969, Peter Bibbes, the president of our Holy Cross parish, asked me to chair an event for the church community, and I suggested the panigiri concept. Our church's nameday is on September 14, the Feastday of the Elevation of the Holy Cross, so we selected the Labor Day holiday weekend for our festival because of its close proximity to the Holy Cross nameday.

At the time, our church did not have facilities to accommodate a festival; therefore, we selected the San Mateo Fairgrounds' Hall of Flowers for the event. With the help of Ellen Stratigos, we reproduced a park-like indoor setting with imitation grass, park benches and a stage. Several Greek restaurants brought their musicians, providing continuous entertainment. A choral group of 14 male singers and six mandolin and guitar players was organized by John Efstathiou and Desi Evangel to present Greek folk songs, or "cantathes." A folk dance group organized by Mary Pappas performed regional dances of Greece in costume. Food booths were organized by Nick Nicholson and Gus Zongus. The bars were chaired by Lee Eurotas. Mary Marcopoulos chaired a large exhibit of paintings of Greece by Greg Condos of Sacramento and other artists.

After several years, the parish was able to hold the festivals on the beautiful church grounds, which each year are transformed into a traditional Greek town square. In 1993, we added an outdoor amphitheatre, a concept created by the ancient Greeks 2500 years ago. Our amphitheatre is used for mythology plays, Greek folk concerts involving a 70-member chorus and orchestra, concerts by the Aurora Mandolin Orchestra, and other performances.

Today, Greek festivals are sponsored by many Greek Orthodox churches across the United States as a way to share our Greek traditions with others. We are blessed to live in a wonderful country in which most of the citizens have roots from elsewhere. Sharing our rich cultures enriches our lives here in the USA.

GREEK RECIPES

Recipes courtesy of Thomy luppa.

STUFFED TOMATOES

Serves 6 Ingredients: 6 large ripe tomatoes 1/4 cup olive oil 1 cup onion, chopped 1 teaspoon granulated sugar 1/2 cup rice 1 pound ground beef or lamb 1 cinnamon stick 1 small clove garlic, crushed 1 tablespoon parsley, finely chopped Salt and pepper, to taste 1 teaspoon chopped mint 1/4 cup Pignola nuts (optional) 1/4 cup dry bread crumbs

Slice tops from stem ends of tomatoes, and scoop out pulp, discarding seeds. Chop pulp and set aside. Place tomatoes in baking pan. In large skillet, saute onions with oil for 5 minutes stirring constantly. Add sugar, rice, beef and lamb, herbs, spices, chopped tomato pulp, nuts, salt, and pepper. Heat mixture to boiling, cover and reduce. Simmer 30 minutes, stirring occasionally. Spoon off all fat. Remove cinnamon stick. Fill tomatoes with rice-meat mixture within 1/4 inch of tops. Toss bread crumbs with remaining oil and sprinkle on top of filling. Bake 35 minutes at 375 degrees.

BAKLAVA

Serves 24

Ingredients: 1 pound walnuts or pecans, finely chopped 1/3 cup sugar 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon cloves 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg 1 pound filo 1 pound butter, clarified, melted and warm Whole cloves (optional) Syrup

Combine nuts, sugar and spices. Trim filo to pan size. Place 6 filo sheets in a buttered 13x9 inch baking pan, brushing each sheet generously with butter. Sprinkle a thin layer of nut mixture evenly over the filo. Cover with 4 buttered filo sheets. Continue alternating filo, butter and nut mixture until all nuts are used. Top with 8 buttered filo sheets. Cut into diamonds or squares. If desired, stud each piece with a whole clove.

Bake at 325 degrees for 30 minutes, lower oven to 300 degrees and bake 30 minutes longer or until golden brown. Pour warm syrup over hot baklava. Let stand for several hours or overnight. Store in air-tight containers in a cool place; it will keep for several weeks. Freezes well; thaw to room temperature and serve.

PASTITSIO

Macaroni and Meat Casserole

Makes 24 squares Ingredients: 2 large onions 3 tablespoons butter 2 lbs lean ground beef Salt and pepper to taste 1 8oz can tomato sauce 1 cup water 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon Dash of sugar 1/2 cup bread crumbs 2 1/2 cups grated parmesan cheese 1 lb Ziti macaroni 1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil Cream sauce (recipe to follow)

In a large saucepan, saute onions in butter until tender. Crumble meat into the pan and brown well. Drain off fat. Add salt, pepper, tomato sauce, water, cinnamon and sugar; simmer for 35-40 minutes or until liquid is absorbed. Remove from heat and cool. Add half the bread crumbs and 1 1/4 cups cheese to the meat mixture.

Cook macaroni in boiling, salted water with oil until almost done. Rinse; drain well. Butter a 17x14 baking pan; sprinkle with 2 tablespoons bread crumbs. Spread half of macaroni (Recipe continued on pg. 61)

on bottom. Sprinkle 1/2 cup cheese over the macaroni. Cover with meat; then spread remaining sauce. Sprinkle the remaining bread crumbs and cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 minutes or until golden brown. Let stand 20 minutes before cutting. Freezes well. To reheat, place frozen pastitsio, covered loosely with foil, in a 350 degree oven for 1 1/2 - 2 hours or until heated through completely.

Cream Sauce

3 tablespoons melted butter 1 cup all purpose flour 5 cups warm milk Dash of nutmeg 6 eggs 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

In a saucepan, melt butter and blend in flour, stirring constantly with a wire whisk. Gradually add warm milk, stirring vigorously until sauce thickens. Add nutmeg, remove from heat and cool. Beat eggs with wire whisk. Add 1/2 cup cooled sauce, then pour back into cream sauce. Stir in cheese.

STUFFED EGGPLANT

Ingredients: 4 medium eggplants Olive oil for frying 2 onions, finely chopped 10 oz ground beef or lamb 1 tablespoon tomato paste 2-3 beefsteak tomatoes, peeled and diced 1 bunch flat-leaved parsley, finely chopped 2 tablespoons bread crumbs 1 1/2 cups Kefalotiri cheese, grated 3 tablespoons butter 2 tablespoons flour 2 cups milk 2 teaspoons lemon juice Freshly grated nutmeg 1 egg, beaten Salt and pepper, to taste

Wash the eggplants and remove the base of the stalks. Heat olive oil in a pan and brown the eggplants on all sides over a high heat. Allow to cool and cut off 1/3 lengthways. Scoop out the flesh from the remainder with a spoon, leaving a 3/8 inch thick edge, finely chop the flesh and set aside. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. For the filling, heat olive oil and fry the onions and ground meat. Add the eggplant flesh, tomato paste and diced tomatoes and simmer gently for about 5 minutes. Stir in the parsley, bread crumbs, and half of the cheese. Place the eggplant halves on a greased baking sheet and fill with the ground meat mixture. Melt the butter in a pan and stir in the flour. Stir in the milk and allow to thicken slowly. Simmer for about 5 minutes and season with lemon juice, nutmeg, salt, and pepper. Pour over the filled eggplants and bake in oven for 50 minutes. Serve hot, with freshly baked bread.

SAGANAKI

Fried Cheese Squares

Makes about 100 pieces Ingredients: 2 lbs Kefalotiri cheese 2 tablespoons lemon juice

Cut cheese into bite-size cubes. In a heavy skillet, fry cheese in hot butter quickly, a few seconds on each side, until golden. Arrange on a platter and sprinkle with lemon juice. Serve hot.

TZATZIKI

Ingredients:


- 2 cups of Greek yogurt, whole milk
- 1 large cucumber, seeded, grated, and drained
- 2 garlic cloves minced
- 1-2 teaspoons dill
- 1 tablespoons olive oil Salt

Peel, seed and grate the cucumber. Let the grated cucumber drain for several hours or overnight. You can also, wrap the grated cucumber in paper towels.

Combine all ingredients.


